* In Germany, unlike here in the U.S. there are no large graveyards and graves are reused after a long period of time. If there is still a family visiting and tending to their deceased loved ones, then those graves will remain. The four Förtmeiers left behind in Germany after their deaths were probably buried in the churchyard graveyard and since all the other family members were in America, their graves were undoubtedly reused. The church, Danielskirche, is located in Lavelshoh, Warmesen, Germany.

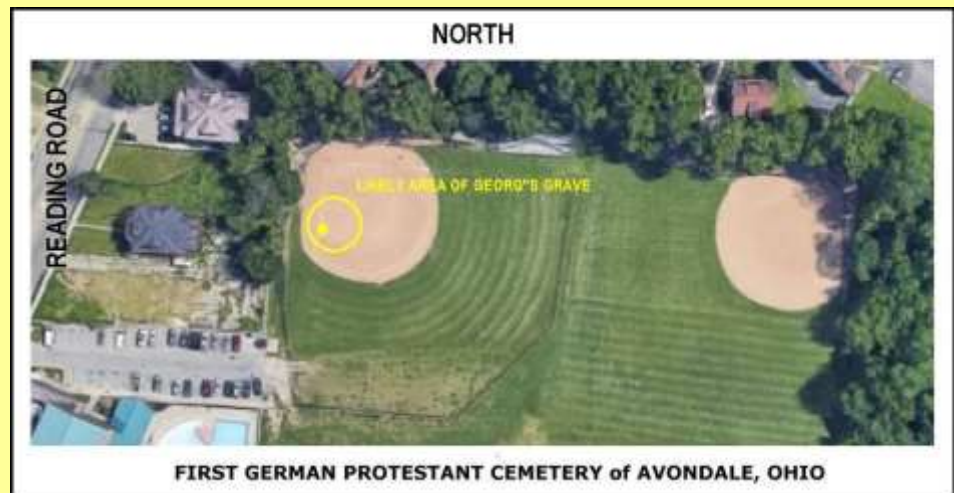
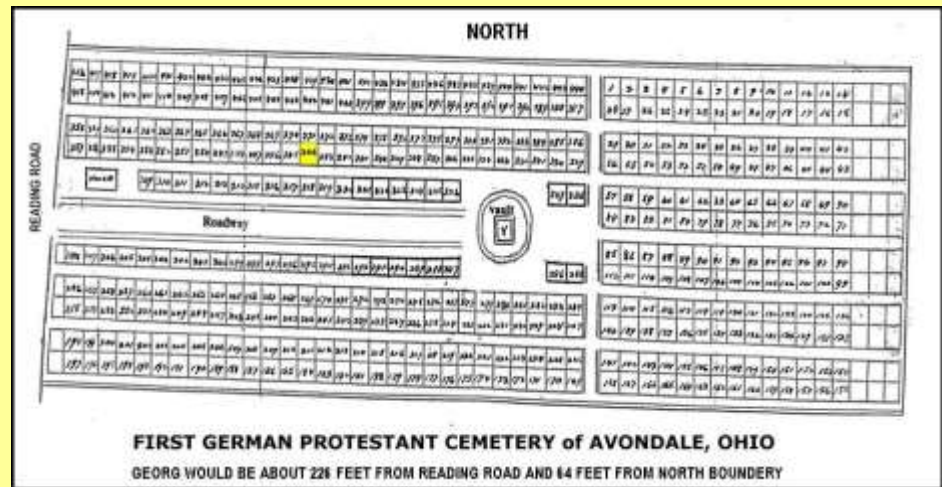

Georg was buried in the “Cholera Cemetery” in 1851. When the new German Cemetery opened In Walnut Hills a lot of families Moved their loved ones to the New cemetery. NO CHOLERA VICTIMS were moved, as it was believed then that doing so could start another epidemic. Georg’s cause of death at age 21 was stated in the newspaper as pneumonia, but I suspect it was really cholera and Georg still rests there with all the other cholera victims. The records do not show him ever being moved. As you can see, the cemetery is gone and the cholera victims forgotten.
